## SELIGMAN AA IS ALIVE AND WELL

Greetings, from Russ H., the new Prescott Intergroup Roving Representative. Apparently, the Intergroup once had a Roving Rep, but not for quite some time. Qualifying by just beating the 1-year (6/27/1986) minimum sobriety requirement, I was able to acquire this position without too much ado. Also volunteering on Fridays at the Intergroup office, from 1:00PM until 4:00 PM, I happened to overhear talk of this position being available. Since I've retired for a couple of years now and enjoying traveling to new places, on Wednesday, the 10<sup>th</sup> of December, 2025, I packed a bag and an envelope full of brochures, meeting lists and a newcomer packet, and headed north on the AZ 89 toward the I-40. Actually, a nice drive (save the 5-minute delay for road work), I continued on the I-40, 22-miles west to downtown Seligman, AZ, located on famous Route 66, and stayed overnight at the very clean Supai Motel. Thursday evening at 6:00 PM, I attended the "We Are Not Saints" meeting of Alcoholics Anonymous, located at 54170 Floyd Street Seligman, AZ 86337 (at the Seligman Library). An open, discussion meeting, I counted 8-sober souls including myself. When it was my turn to share, I introduced myself as a grateful alcoholic, describing my position as the Prescott AA Intergroup Roving Representative. Explaining my duties to the group, I mentioned that my position entitled me to travel to outlying area AA groups. Additionally, I reported that it was my honor to let their group know that Prescott Intergroup was always there for things they might need to continue them to grow. Incidentally, I discovered that their group actually began at the local church several decades prior and that the group dissolved a few years later. This prompted several members to start a new group, beginning in the 90's at their current location, at the library. The Seligman group is represented by a good mix of sobriety dates, including recent newcomers to those with more than 20 years of sobriety. That evening, each member shared their experience, strength, and hope, with the meeting ending the way Bill and Bob ended theirs so many years ago. After the meeting was over, there were goodies laid out on a table, along with good strong AA coffee. I would note that the members expressed their gratitude to the Intergroup realizing that we were there for them. My personal experience of this adventure was of honor and excitement. If you're ever near the Seligman turn-off on a Thursday around 6:00 PM, please check out the "We Are Not Saints" group of Alcoholics Anonymous; you'll be glad you did!
